

# **Consultation on a draft Direct Payments policy**

Southampton City Council (SCC) is consulting on a draft Direct Payments (DP) policy, co-produced with a range of people including those who receive or manage a DP and their carers, health and social care providers, Adult Social Care (ASC) practitioners, and other key stakeholders.

We would like to hear your thoughts on the proposals and any impacts or alternative suggestions you would like us to consider. Now is your opportunity to have your say.

### Aims & key changes

Our goal is to co-produce a new draft Direct Payment (DP) Policy by working in partnership with a wide range of people, including those who receive or manage a DP, their carers, providers, Adult Social Care (ASC) practitioners, Healthwatch, and other key stakeholders.

Together, we want to:

- > Create a policy that is meaningful, accessible, and fit for purpose;
- > Ensure individuals are paid fairly and in line with legislation, and;
- > Simplify how we review and uplift payments, so that people's Direct Payments keep pace with the cost of services.

Based on this, we are proposing to update our policy with the following key changes:

- > The draft policy has been co-produced with service users and staff, using clearer language to improve clarity and accessibility, so people can better understand their rights and our responsibilities, and;
- > The proposed introduction of standardised rates to simplify payments and ensure they keep pace with the cost of services.

The proposed standard rates are:

- > An hourly rate for people using agency providers;
- > An hourly rate for people employing Personal Assistants, and;
- > An hourly rate for people employing self-employed Personal Assistants.

### Our journey so far

We've already taken big steps forward through co-production sessions with DP recipients, carers, providers, Healthwatch, and ASC practitioners.

Coproduction is a way of working, whereby everybody works together on an equal basis. They create a service or come to a decision which works for them all. It is built on the principle that those who use a service are best placed to help design it.

We have completed an Equality and Safety Impact Assessment for the draft policy, which outlines the key changes and considers how they may impact both existing and future direct payment recipients, and what measures the council needs to take to mitigate this impact. Through co-production, people told us that the proposed Direct Payments policy should include the following:

We were told the draft policy should	Our response
Be clear on its commitments, stating what a Direct Payment should be used for, promote independence, flexibility and freedom of choice.	Our commitments are outlined in the draft policy, where we have stated that a Direct Payment should:  • Offer freedom of choice. It should ensure that people can choose the type of support they receive, who delivers it and when.  • Promote independence and recognise that the person, and/or their carers, often know how to meet their support needs best.  • Provide flexibility to acknowledge that a person's care and support needs may vary day to day.
Be concise and easy to understand.	<ul> <li>The draft policy uses clear, consistent language and avoids using jargon and legal terms where possible.</li> <li>Where this is unavoidable, simple definitions and explanations have been provided.</li> </ul>
Include an Easy read version.	We have developed an easy read version which has been included in the documentation.
Make it clear that reviews are annual but can be requested earlier if needed.	Information on reviews can be found in the councils Adult Social Care and Support Planning Policy. The proposed Direct Payment Policy refers to this as the Coproduction group agreed that we should avoid duplication. I'd just shorten to "The DP policy refers to this policy to avoid duplication" Partially updated - keen to include reference to coproduction
Align funds with service costs, including yearly uplifts due to inflation.	The draft policy introduces standardised rates, which can be uplifted each year in line with the criteria set out. This will help the council ensure that an individual's direct payment continues to keep pace with the cost of services.  It is important to highlight that standard rates are only one aspect of calculating an individual's personal budget, and so the amount an individual receives for their direct payment will still be individualised and person-centred, as per their care and support plan.
Provide better guidance/training, including resources for invoice management and record keeping.	Our first step is to consult on this draft policy. Following this and if the draft policy is formally approved, we will be coproducing a range of guidance documents to support individuals.
