

# Finding out more about your Council Tax

The Valuation Office Agency (VOA) maintains the Council Tax Valuation List. This includes placing new properties within a Council Tax band and changing bands for properties when necessary.

To understand why your property is in a certain band, please go to GOV.UK and search: 'How domestic properties are assessed for Council Tax bands'.

### Adult Social Care precept

The Southampton City Council charge on the Council Tax bill includes the overall change attributable to the adult social care precept.

# Discounts, reductions, and exemptions

Remember: If you apply, you will still have to pay the amount stated on your bill until we make a decision.

### Reduction for those on low income/benefits

We can review your income and circumstances to see whether the amount you pay can be reduced.

### Properties exempt from Council Tax

While all properties have to register for Council Tax, you don't have to pay if everyone living in the property is on the exemption list.

The main groups are:

- Full time students, student nurses, apprentices and youth training trainees
- Under 18 years old
- Severely mentally impaired
- Diplomats & certain dependants
- Dependant relatives in self-contained parts of the property (e.g. granny annexe)
- Patients living in hospital / care homes

## **Single Person Discount**

Council tax is based on at least two adults (18 years old or over) living in the property. If you live on your own or all other adults in the property are on the exemption list, you can get 25% off your bill.

## Reduction for disabled people

You may be entitled if you, or someone who lives at your property, are disabled and the property has certain features.

### **Reduction for Care Leavers**

Care Leavers up to the age of 25 years old may be entitled for a reduction on their Council Tax.

### **Empty properties**

A Council Tax premium will be charged if a property has been empty and unfurnished for:

Between one and five years - an additional 100% Council Tax is payable

Between five and ten years - an additional 200% Council Tax is payable

Over ten years - an additional 300% Council Tax is payable

### Second Home Premiums

From 1st April 2025 dwellings that are furnished and have no resident will incur a 100% premium. More information can be found here:

# **Paperless Billing**

We have now moved to paperless billing for all of our customers, these are sent by email with a link to view a PDF copy of your correspondence. You can download and save the bill for your records.

If you are still receiving paper bills, you can opt in to paperless billing by completing the form at Submit a Council Tax enquiry selecting the option 'Request to Opt in to paperless Billing'. Please note – you will need your Council Tax account number to complete the form. You can find this on your Council Tax bill.
