

5.4 OLD TOWN CHARACTER AREA


5.4.1 Role in the Urban Design Framework



5.4.2 Open Space Design Objectives

- Key visitas lowerds the waterfront should be protected. The visual contidors along Prench Skill regis Street and Bugle Street should be maintained.
- Reinforce main north-south pedestrian routes The public realm along the High Street should be refurbished to complete an amprived connection, with the waterfront and opportunities for street the planting should be encouraged since possible.
- Define improved east-west links with key public spaces - Connections to the eastern character area should be reinforced with a new public space around Holyrood Church and clear pedestrian links arong bernard Street and Strough to Oxford Street.

 Public resim furnishings and furniture should reflect the historic character of the area - 5 coordinated palette of struct forniture should be network for the area that reflects the traditions of the area yet avoids a bestage pasticle, whilst paying materials should be sympathetic to the vernacular natural stones used for original peyings and buildings.

5.4.3 Architectural Design Objectives

- Maintain the medieval mass and scale of the historie urban form - Future development, and concernelly redevelopment of existing large buildings should respect the tight orban grain. Primerily ban in more strong building heights should be supportinged and built out to edjacent party with where these usids.
- Historic elements should provide the key tanomarks and for al points for the area - The setting of the Banate St. Michaels Clumb and the original wall gateways should be enhanced to reflect their stature as key landmarks defining the character of the area.
- Mointain the permeability of the urban grain The extenne right network of streets should be maintained and improved permeability across the eastern side of the tiligh Street defined within new development sites.



- Promote a stear definition to historic edges and building fromtages - The eastern alignment of the original Town Walls should be strungthened when new development permits and improved peacetrian routes created along the boundary of original Town Wall. New multing moterness should extend to the back of the foulpath to maintain the history galtern of building alignment.
- Respect the traditional pattern and variaty of rooffinac - New buildings should respect traditional forms of roof design that provide an attractive variety of detailing and textures.
- Select-construction materials and external detailing that is is keeping with traditional forms
 New buildings should draw on traditional materials and detailing in Recping with adjacent facades.

 Espand the current range of activities within the same - Additional uses standid be promoted that complement the exciting residential and manufacture based activities in the annu.
