The site was described and shown on the above mentioned plan is considered by Southampton City Council to be contaminated land, as defined by Section 78(A)2 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 by reason of substances in, on or under the land.


## Information regarding the issuing of Notice

It is the statutory duty of Southampton City Council (as the enforcing authority in this instance) to ensure that the land determined as being contaminated land is appropriately remediated. The issuing of this notice is to be regarded as the starting point to a formal process of discussions and consultation as to what remediation might be appropriate and who is responsible to bear the costs. If Southampton City Council – Environmental Health Services is not satisfied that appropriate remediation is being carried out, or will be carried out, it has a statutory duty to serve a remediation notice to those identified as being appropriate persons that will specify the necessary remediation actions that they are obliged to undertake. A minimum three months interval will exist between the notice of determination and the service of any remediation notice. If an appropriate person does not comply with the requirements of a remediation notice they may be liable for prosecution.

If you have been notified as an appropriate person and so that you can consider what information you might wish to provide to Southampton City Council – Environmental Health Services to support any claims for exclusion from liability or for a particular appointment of liability please refer to:
