

## **Lane Rental Scheme Proposal Consultation**

Southampton City Council is consulting on proposals to apply to the Department for Transport to run a potential Lane Rental scheme in the city.

## Proposal

Southampton City Council is proposing to introduce a Lane Rental Scheme on a proportion of its road network in accordance with the Street Works (Charges for Occupation of the Highway) (England) Regulations 2012 (the Lane Rental Regulations) made under Section 74A.

Lane Rental (LR) is a scheme introduced to help manage the impact of works on the highway network on some of the busiest roads at the busiest times, seeking to reduce delays for residents & businesses.

The implementation of a Lane Rental Scheme would allow the Council to charge any works promoter carrying out any registerable works in the street for the time those works occupy the highway, with the aim to reduce the amount of time traffic is disrupted whilst works are being carried out.

In order to have a scheme in the city, a detailed application must be submitted to the Department for Transport and work has been underway to analyse data to create a network and a scheme for the city for consultation, ahead of an application to the DfT.

All utility, developer, private and Highway Authority works on an LR road would attract a daily charge, which would go into a fund pot. It can then be used to cover the cost of running the scheme in the first instance and remaining funds could also be used to help fund projects to help mitigate disruption caused by road works.

The scheme proposal aims to establish a scheme that encourages behavioural changes in the execution of work on the highway, either by limiting activity during peak times or adopting alternative methods to reduce disruption to residents and business reliant on the City's highway network to benefit residents, businesses and visitors to the city.

In accordance with the Lane Rental Schemes: Guidance for English Highway Authorities issued by the Department for Transport on the 17 March 2024, Southampton City Council is entering a period of public consultation. The consultation period will be open from the 24 January 2025 to 06 March 2025.
