The new financial year started in April with the Juniors supporting the ABP Marathon as they have done for over 10 years.





#### Planter & Woodland Project

The Junior Wardens have been supporting one of our Family Hubs and revamping the front of Blackberry Hub in Thornhill.

The planters to the main entrance had become rotten and started to become dangerous. Working jointly with the Community Payback team the first stage of the project was completed on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> February by 2 really hard-working lads, thank you.

#### Phase 2

The Junior Wardens returned on Friday 31<sup>st</sup> May for phase 2, putting the finishing touches to the planters. They topped up the soil, weeded the planters and the block paving and put in some colorful new plants. They also went on a Woodland Walk with Jill Doubleday from Wilder Southampton, learning about the nature & wildlife around the area of Donkey Common.







Men's Shed Bitterne produced some carvings of woodland creatures for Juniors to paint and attach to the planters. The Junior Wardens have decorated these which will be attached to the planters to brighten them and also be a learning aid for parents attending the Hub and Brambles pre-school.

#### Tanners Brook Walkways

This is the first stage of a three-stage project involving the Junior Wardens, Open Spaces, Community Safety, and Highways.

We 1st had a consultation with parents and residents who use the subway and walkways through to Tanners Brook School. Consultation was around the walkways, overgrown areas and the subways themselves.

Looking at the consultation results (below) it was clear that the priority, and quickest to resolve, were the walkways leading to the school.

So, in October half term we arrived on mass to tackle the walkway works with the Junior Wardens, Neighbourhood Wardens & Open Spaces, cleaning, clearing and tidying. Some parents also stayed to join in.

Stage 2 later in the year, will involve a further consultation on potential artwork to go under the subway once it's been repaired (this is under discussion as we speak)

We would also like to include some artwork relating to supporters from the retail units, B&M Store, Aldi's, and Ten Pin Bowling (depending on their support)

Stage 3 We would be producing the actual artwork after the subway flooding issues are resolved (no timeline at present).

We would be working together with local artists, national artists and the Junior Wardens to brighten the subway with murals/spray art.
