

- 1. Enclosed wildlife area protects a section of beach from visitors and dogs.
- 2. The gravel paths are long and straight to echo the areas Roman heritage. Emphasises the view from Bitterne Road.
- 3. Bunding to prevent unauthorised vehicular entry.
- 4. Car Park with bunding to control vehicular access onto the park. Litter bins.
- 5. Picnic benches,
- 6. Informal play such as fallen trees and timber in the woodland.
- 7. Sycamore thicket thinned leaving the best trees to mature and to allow underplanting with native bulbs
- 8. The existing entrance restored to it's original design, with additional Park Identity Marker.
