BYE-LAW for the Good Rule and Government of the Borough of Southampton and for the prevention of Nuisances made by the Council of the Borough in pursuance of Section 249 of the Local Government Act, 1933, at a meeting of the Council held on the 15th day of April, 1936.

ROLLER-SKATING ON HIGHWAYS.

1. No person shall on any public highway within the Borough rink or skate on rollers, wheels or other mechanical contrivances to the danger of other persons lawfully using the said highway.

PENALTY CLAUSE.

2. Any person who shall offend against the foregoing Bye-law shall be liable on summary conviction for every such offence to a fine not exceeding forty shillings.
