PVI Early Years SENCO Award



CACHE SENCo Level 3 - Cohort 8

Southampton Early Years Advisory Teachers are pleased to offer another round of this exciting, accredited training opportunity for SENDCos in PVI settings working with children under five. This innovative programme has been constructed in collaboration with educators, training organisations,

SEND professionals, setting SENCOs and managers from the PVI sector to ensure it is meaningful.

The Early Years SENCO Award has proven to inspire SENCOs from across the PVI Sector, offering practitioners both theoretical and practical support in their role as coordinators of SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities). The aim of this training is to develop the skills, knowledge and understanding of Early Years SENCOs to ensure that they are capable and confident to effectively support the children and families they work with.

A range of professionals and agencies will deliver information throughout the programme, to allow SENCOs to have a thorough understanding of the services and support available to them.

Why attend?

On successful completion of the course, participant will gain 'Southampton Early Years SENCO Award' accredited with the Level 3 CACHE unit 'Special Educational Needs Coordinator in Early Years Settings'. In addition, practitioners will also be awarded with 5 credits toward a level 4 CACHE qualification. It is anticipated that the DfE will require all Early Years SENCOs to have this accreditation.

What will it cover?

The Role of the SENCO; SEND Code of Practice; Working with parents and professionals; Networking opportunity with other settings and professionals; Historical context or SEND and education

What does it involve?

The course will require 100% commitment from attendees with full support from their manager. The training will be full day training sessions, approximately once every two weeks, over a period of 6 months (12 sessions in total). There will also be a celebration event on completion of the training.

What does it cost?

The Accreditation Training would normally cost £1200 + VAT per delegate, however Southampton Early Years Advisory Teachers have been fortunate to secure funding to enable one SENCO from each PVI setting to receive this training free of charge. The funding for this training is time-limited and we cannot guarantee that future training opportunities will be funded.

A non-refundable deposit of £100 is required to secure your place, however the cost of the training and Assessor Fee will be waived. If delegates do not complete the training, the £400 Assessor Fee must be paid.

'Every practitioner a SEND practitioner'

Southampton Early Years Advisory Teachers are pleased to offer a seventh cohort of this exciting, accredited training opportunity for practitioners in PVI settings and childminders working with children under 5.

The aim of this training is to develop the skills, knowledge and understanding of Early Years practitioners to ensure that they are capable and confident to effectively support the children and families they work with. A range of professionals and agencies will deliver information throughout the programme, to allow practitioners to have a thorough understanding of how to support children with SEND.

Why attend?

The course will culminate in receiving a level 2 CACHE endorsed unit, alongside knowledge of SEND and best practice gained along the way.

What will it cover?

Delegates will complete module-based assessments, all of which is explained to delegates during their first day.

What does it involve?

The course will require 100% commitment from attendees with full support from their manager. The training is carried out over 9 x 2 hour sessions. The sessions are delivered weekly. The first session is in person, at Start Point Sholing, followed by virtual sessions over Teams. The study sessions are completed independently with an Area SENDCo available to support over Teams if required.



TRANSITION TO SCHOOL PROJECT 2025

Early Years and Childcare Providers and YR Teachers are invited to join the Early Years Advisory Teachers for the Transition to School Project 2025.

UNDERSTANDING RESTRICTIVE PRACTICES IN THE EARLY YEARS

Due to the increase in the number of physical interventions being reported and observed, the Local Authority have developed a tailored 3 hour workshop, specifically for Early Years and Childcare providers.

This training will focus on developing an understanding of:

- statutory requirements with in the EYFS around Restrictive practices.
- physical interventions and supporting delegates to be able to identify restrictive practices.
- behaviour as a form of communication.
- non-restrictive practices to manage behaviour and explore strategies to de-escalate behaviour.
