

Proposed SEN resourced provision at Cantell School consultation

Background

Southampton has a diverse special school offer that needs to grow in order to meet the changing needs of the population. We are proposing that this growth happens alongside the mainstream school offer in the city in the form of resourced provisions.

Southampton City Council is therefore consulting on proposals to open a resourced provision at Cantell School.

SEN resourced provision is where places are reserved at mainstream schools specifically for SEN pupils, with these schools receiving additional funding from the local council to support these places, for example, by providing special facilities.

This proposal for Cantell School would provide ten secondary school places to children and young people in Southampton that have moderate learning difficulties with associated speech, language, communication needs and/or autism.

Pupils placed in the resourced provision would have Education, Health & Care Plans (EHCPs) and may come from any area of Southampton.

We would like to hear your thoughts on the proposals and any impacts or alternative suggestions you would like us to consider. Now is your opportunity to have your say.

Proposals for Cantell School

We are proposing to open a resourced provision for ten pupils with moderate learning difficulties with associated speech, language, communication needs and/or autism.

This would be within the main school building where pupils would split their time between a specialist base and mainstream areas of the school. Pupils in attendance would be supported by a small team of dedicated staff as well as have access to specialist subject teachers across the school.
