Background

As a Licensing Authority, Southampton City Council aim to ensure that sex establishments in the city operate in a safe, fair and discreet manner and are sensitive to the local area in which they are situated.

Sex establishments fall into one of the following categories:

- Sex shops
- Sex cinemas
- Sexual entertainment venues

The current Sex Establishment Licensing Policy is dated from 2013, however, minor amendments to the standard rules and conditions were added in 2020. Southampton City Council are now reviewing the overall policy.

We are proposing the following:

- An updated list of offences for not granting licenses
- New section on placing a restriction on the density of venues
- Merging sections 1 & 2 together to create an easier read
- Suggesting no further changes to the Sex Establishment Licensing Policy

Adding more offences to the list for not granting licenses

We are proposing that the draft Sex Establishment Licensing Policy contains an updated list

regarding offences for not granting licenses. This is for applicants and licence holders to consider when making their applications.
The policy currently contains a list of the following offences to consider:
Sexual offencesOffences involving prostitution, drugs, dishonesty or violence; andLicensing offences.

- Slavery offences - Offences involving exploitation

New section placing a restriction on density of venues

Currently, we do not decide on the density of the venues. However, we are proposing to introduce a new section detailing placing a restriction on the density of venues.

Southampton City Council would like to avoid unwanted marketing of these venues and are therefore, proposing each venue should be separated by at least 250 metres, as measured in a straight line.
